DRAFT TERMS OF REFERENCE RELEASED FOR COMMENT

The Queensland Government has released for public comment on the Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) and draft Terms of Reference (TOR) for Stage 1 of the proposed Traveston Crossing Dam.

The draft terms of reference will be open for public comment until 19 February 2007.

The draft Terms of Reference mapped out issues to be examined as part of the EIS requirements for the dam.

This is the first phase of a community consultation process to be conducted on the proposed dam.

The objective of the EIS is to ensure all potential environmental, social and economic impacts of the project are identified and assessed and that steps are outlined about how to mitigate any adverse impacts.

The draft terms cover key issues including the potential impacts on endangered species such as the Mary River Cod, Mary River Tortoise and vulnerable Australian lungfish and the potential impacts on the water quality and habitats of the Great Sandy Strait Ramsar Wetland and World Heritage-listed Fraser Island.

The Deputy Premier and Minister for Infrastructure Anna Bligh advises that the draft Terms of Reference also address issues the community raised with her at the Gympie meeting including the potential for weed growth and algae blooms and an assessment of the risk of any potential transfer of pathogen organisms between river basins.

To ensure the process is as robust and comprehensive as possible the EIS will also consider alternatives to the project as well as other dam locations and outline the reasons for selecting preferred options.

Queensland Water Infrastructure (QWI), the company delivering the dam, will hold a community information day on the project, including the EIS process, on Saturday 16 December at 1825 Mary River Valley Road, Amamoor, from 11am to 3pm.

Submissions on the draft terms of reference will inform the final terms of reference which will govern the scope of technical studies to be undertaken on the proposed dam over the next year.

Both the State and Federal governments will review the EIS after the project was declared a controlled action under the Environment Protection and Biodiversity Conservation (EPBC) Act 1999. www.deh.gov.au

Stage 1 of the proposed Traveston Crossing Dam involves the construction of a new dam in the Mary River at about 27 km upstream of Gympie.

Stage 1 of the proposed dam has a full supply level of 71 metres and is located within the Cooloolool, Maroochy and Noosa Shires.

The project has been declared a significant project by the Coordinator-General for which an EIS is required in accordance with the State Development and Public Works Organization Act 1971.

BUSINESS ADJUSTMENT SCHEME

As a result of the announcement of the proposed Traveston Crossing and Wyalong Dams, QRAA is providing financial assistance on behalf of the Queensland Government to businesses that have been affected.

The Business Adjustment Scheme enables eligible businesses to seek business advice assistance to assess if the business has the ability to restructure and be viable in a changed economy.

If restructuring is not possible and exiting the business is the only realistic option as a result of the impact of the proposed dams, the Scheme will also assist businesses to exit the regional economy.

QRAA staff delivered approximately 500 information kits to various locations in preparation for information sessions on the Business Adjustment Scheme.

These information sessions were held at Imbil, Kandanga, Amamoor, Carters Ridge, Federal and Gympie from 14 to 22 November, and were attended by a total of 81 business owners.

State Development Centre Sunshine Coast Officers have met with 48 business owners since the Deputy Premier's announcement of the Business Adjustment Scheme on 3 November 2006.

QRAA representatives have also held meetings with business owners at the Kandanga One-Stop-Shop on 29 and 30 November and 6 and 7 December 2006, to discuss their options under the Business Adjustment Scheme.

Further, State Development Centre Sunshine Coast Officers and QRAA have mailed out or provided by hand 52 application/information packages.

QRAA has received three applications for Business Advice Assistance as at 8 December 2006.

A series of Business Development workshops will be offered through State Development Centre Sunshine Coast specifically in the Mary River Valley Region and by State Development Centre Maryborough in the Cooloola Region, to affected businesses to assist them in planning for their future. The first of these was held on 9 November 2006 at Imbil, and was attended by 12 business owners.

WORKER ASSISTANCE PROGRAM IN PLACE AND AVAILABLE

The Worker Assistance Program helps people who have lost their jobs when their previous employer has closed or downsized causing regional retrenchments.

If people have lost their jobs as a result of the government's decision to build the proposed dams at Traveston Crossing or Wyalong, they are eligible for assistance if they have not found suitable work of more than 20 hours per week.

People may be eligible for up to a total of \$5 000 in assistance to help them find a new job.

This is not a cash payment, but if approved the Department of State Development and Trade will pay for:

- up to \$1 000 towards job preparation
- up to \$3 000 towards employment training
- up to \$2 000 relocation assistance
- \$2 000 employer wage subsidy - paid to the new employer after people commence a new job.

FRIENDS OF KANDANGA LODGE PROPOSALS

The Friends of Kandanga submitted 17 recommendations during the recent Office of Urban Management planning meeting.

The recommendations will feature in the outcomes of the studies being conducted by the Office of Urban Management and the Department of Local Government, Planning, Sport and Recreation.

The Friends of Kandanga will be among representatives from the Kandanga Community involved in the studies program.

The list of concerns and suggestions put forward at the Kandanga meeting include

- Any facilities that are relocated because of the dam are still to be controlled by the community.
- Relocate sporting fields and community buildings to where the existing tennis courts are and create a community sporting complex.
- The requisition of vacant land for public facilities by making contact with owners now to decide the possibility of relocating public facilities.
- Residents relocated for new infrastructure. Is it possible to develop a plan without relocating homes and if relocation is necessary it may not be necessary until Stage 2.
- Information Centre and 24 hours Stop Over facility has been approved and can this go ahead as recommended by the community.
- That any proposed shopping centre precinct might make provision for existing business operators in the town such as the butcher, the shop and Post Office
- Statistics of the demographic of town make-up to be compiled.
- Kann Park, Enviro Park and Bunya Park were created by the community and replacement parks be provided.
- Kandanga Bowls Club and Mary River Valley Heritage rail are integral and substantial income has been derived from this partnership creating a present Win Win situation for both parties. There will be a requirement to develop the necessary transportation program for patrons from the railway to the new bowls club location.
- The land east of the cemetery be purchased for immediate use as an extension.
- Research of different retirement facilities for displaced older community members.
- Teenagers' needs are important and that an area is required for teenager facilities to develop a skate park, youth centre and push bike facility.
- As access from Kandanga Creek will be directly affected, need a new direct access route.
- The State Government to fund a sewerage treatment plant for Town sewerage and all connections subsidized.
- Existing public toilets in Main Street have no accessibility for handicapped people. The building is in need of repair and no longer suitable for public use. While the Council has a budget allocation nothing has eventuated, felt that regardless of the future of the dam that the public toilets need rebuilding now.
- Need for the affected Town Memorial and the historic tree to be relocated.

LAND USE AND INFRASTRUCTURE PLANS AND MEETINGS

Locals from the townships of Kandanga, Imbil and Carters Ridge are gathering their thoughts and some are forming committees to help support regional planning work being undertaken by the Office of Urban Management.

Partnered by the Department of Local Government, Planning, Sport and Recreation, and reporting to the Community Futures Task Force, the Office of Urban Management has recently begun work on the proposed Traveston Crossing Dam Land Use and Infrastructure Planning Study.

The Study is designed to address land use impacts in the Mary River Valley arising from the proposed dam. The aim is to create a land use resettlement and infrastructure plan that seeks to mitigate the impacts for the loss of land to the proposed dam. The plan seeks to maximise the various opportunities presented by the proposed dam, and help create a vision for the future planning of affected communities and townships.

To start this process, the team from the Office of Urban Management recently held a series of introductory meetings to explore the issues and opportunities for the towns of Kandanga, Imbil/Brooloo and Carters Ridge. A meeting will be held in Federal early 2007.

Although clearly opposed to the proposed dam, some community members were prepared to examine and consider options, issues, ideas and new opportunities. Some ideas and concerns were also voiced at the meetings (and will be made available on the Office of Urban Management's website), whilst others have been provided direct to the Office of Urban Management.

In Kandanga several community members volunteered to form a committee to meet early in the new year to talk through ideas for how to best plan for the townships and broader areas. At Imbil, the meeting agreed to hold further independent discussions before calling another whole of town meeting again in early February with the Office of Urban Management. At Carters Ridge, the community members have indicated they would like to hold a number of local meetings without State Government involvement with a view to meeting with the Office of Urban Management again in February 2007.

Ideas from these meetings and subsequent committees will be used to inform the next round of community consultation workshops – likely to take place in early March 2007. At these workshops, the community will be asked to review potential options and provide their thoughts and ideas.

Anyone who wishes to provide their thoughts and ideas to the planning study, or who wishes to be involved in these local steering committees should contact the Office of Urban Management.

Running alongside this work with individual communities, the Office of Urban Management will also look at options for land use planning across the broader Mary River Valley region. Workshops on these broader potential land use options will likely take place in March/April 2007. Potential options will then be developed for further consultation in June 2007. The full study is planned to be finalised late 2007.

MARY RIVER VALLEY SCHOOLS READY FOR NEW YEAR

Despite some fluctuations in enrolment numbers towards the end of 2006, enrolments for 2007 now appear to have settled and teacher numbers in Valley schools should remain stable.

Full consideration of the circumstances around the schools of the Valley and consultation with the community would occur before any decision to change staffing allocations is made. 2006 has been a very significant year for the schools of the Mary River Valley.

As always, the welfare of Valley students has been a priority for school staff during 2006, and through the activities that teachers have undertaken with Guidance Officers, school communities have worked hard to try to reduce the anxiety that students may have been feeling during the year.

Decisions around staffing in all Queensland State Schools are finalized on the eighth day of the new school year.

Education Queensland is keenly aware of the high quality educational service provided by the schools of the Mary River Valley.

Information on the academic achievement of the students of the Valley indicates that this has been a positive year for learning.

In terms of general school life, children have been working hard with their teachers and achieving well.

Highlights of the year include the selection of several students from Valley schools to represent the Wide Bay Burnett Region in a range of sports, the Celebrity Cake Stall, held at Kandanga State School, the end of year camps, upgrades of learning resources and improvement of facilities for all Valley schools.

All Mary River Valley schools are finishing the year well and looking forward to the introduction of the Preparatory Year in 2007.

School will recommence for all students on Monday 29 January 2007.

HOME ASSIST AVAILABLE IN MARY RIVER VALLEY

Home Assist Secure is a service available in the Mary River Valley which provides practical assistance for older people and people with a disability who need home maintenance, minor repairs, subsidised assistance and advice to remain living in their home.

In the Mary River Valley, Home Assist Secure and the Home Modification Service are sponsored by the Home Maintenance and Security Service Association Inc (HOMESSA) which is a non profit community service organisation

Home Assist Secure aims to remove some of the practical house related difficulties experienced by older and disabled people living in the community.

Service staff can also refer and assist if necessary with the employing of tradespeople, contracting experts or planning future work.

Subsidised assistance helps people who are unable to obtain alternative assistance with minor home

maintenance, repairs, modifications and security which relate to their health safety and security.

For home security, staff trained by the Queensland Police Service can inspect your home and help you decide on security related repairs and installations. They can also provide information about personal security.

Home Modification

The Home Modification Service is a combined Queensland Health Home and Community Care and Department of Housing initiative to provide a range of modification services to eligible clients.

It was established to provide a range of modifications for older people, carers and people with a disability who meet the eligibility criteria. The service provides assessment, information, project management and/or financial assistance with larger home modifications such as ramps, water lifts, bathroom adaptations and other access issues.

HOMESSA Inc can contribute up to 50% of the total job value up to \$12,000. Any costs in excess of \$12,000 are paid in full by the client.

To be eligible you must be 60 years and over or of any age with a disability and to receive subsidized assistance for work on your home you need to be receiving an Australian Government allowance or payment and unable to make use of other forms of assistance such as Home and Community Care, Department of Veterans Affairs, family or friends.
