## INFORMATION DAY ON ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT STATEMENT HELD

More than 40 people attended a community information day on the proposed Wyaralong Dam Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) process.

The information day was hosted by Queensland Water Infrastructure (QWI) on Saturday 10 February at Bicentennial Park, Boonah following the release of the draft Terms of Reference (ToR) by the Coordinator-General on 13 January 2007.

Members of the community took advantage of the opportunity to speak to QWI project team members and ask questions about the community engagement process. Attendees were encouraged to review the draft ToR and were provided with instructions as to how to participate in the review by providing comments on the content of the draft ToR to the Coordinator-General's office.

QWI's Chief Executive Officer, Mr Graeme Newton, said the day offered the chance for the Boonah and Beaudesert communities to learn more about the EIS process and how they could get involved.

"Our aim was to provide an open environment for people to digest the available information at their own pace and speak to some of the project team to seek clarification or ask further questions," Mr Newton said.

"Although feedback on the draft ToR needs to be directed to the Coordinator-General, we believe it is important and appropriate to make copies available and encourage the community to have input in shaping the final studies that will be undertaken as part of the EIS," he said.

"Those who attended the day demonstrated an interest to learn more about the EIS process and took advantage of the opportunity to speak to project team members and QWI staff."

Feedback collected at the Information Day will be collated and where relevant, responses will be made. This information will then be reported in the final consultation report for the project.

A number of other information days will be held throughout the EIS process during 2007.

# PROGRESS REPORTS ON SOCIAL, ECONOMIC AND ENVIRONMENTAL PROJECTS

The member agencies of the Community Futures Task Force (CFTF) have started a number of social, economic and land use projects and studies. The following is a progress report on those initiatives:

## SOCIAL PROJECTS AND STUDIES

### SW1. WYARALONG ONE STOP SHOP

#### Project Description

The Department of Communities operates the Wyaralong One Stop Shop at 13 Church Street, Boonah. Lifeline has been contracted to provide a service operating from the One Stop Shop, including outreach services. The Shop operates from 10:00am to 4:00pm Monday to Friday.

#### Project Purpose

The One Stop Shop provides:

- advice on government services;
- referral service to other government agencies; and
- counselling support to individuals.

#### Progress Report – Government Services

- The Wyaralong One Stop Shop opened on 3 August 2006.
- To 25 January 2007 the One Stop Shop has had a total of 106 enquiries from people seeking information, advice, or individual counselling.
- Ongoing referral assistance is provided to individuals wanting to access the services of Queensland Government agencies.
- Counselling services have been provided to nine (9) people.
- The number of enquiries made at the One Stop Shop has been low.
- Since December 2006 the numbers of enquiries have dropped off significantly.

#### Timelines/Milestones

In early 2007 the Task Force will consult with stakeholders about future operations of the One Stop Shop

### SW2. COMMUNITY FUTURES TASK FORCE SUPPORT PROGRAM

#### Project Description

The CFTF is an independent body established to address the immediate effects of the decision to build the Traveston Crossing and Wyaralong Dams and identify opportunities that enable the communities to position themselves for the future.

The Task Force is chaired by Major General Peter Arnison and its members include the mayors of the Boonah, Beaudesert, Cooloola, Maroochy, and Noosa Shires and directors-general of the key Queensland Government departments.

The Task Force meet on a regular basis to address the immediate concerns of the community and to coordinate longer term Task Force projects that are being led by the departments.

#### Purpose of the Project

The purpose of the Task Force is to:

- Address the immediate affects on individuals and communities, arising from the decision to build the dams.
- Develop strategies to maximise the longer term opportunities presented by the proposed dams.
- Ensure community engagement in the Task Force work program and provide regular community information.
- Provide community/government linkages to address issues and impacts.

#### Progress Report

- Major General Peter Arnison has made five (5) visits to the Boonah and Wyaralong areas to meet with individuals and attend community meetings.
- Staff of the Task Force have made an additional three (3) visits to the region to follow up on issues raised by individuals and community groups.
- The Task Force has provided support to individuals who are immediately affected by the proposed Wyaralong Dam.
- The Task Force has published four (4) newsletters to the communities in the Boonah and Wyaralong areas, informing them about services that are available and, where appropriate, developments in relation to the proposed dam.
- The Task Force has established a website to inform communities about information resources and services that are available as well as forthcoming events.
- The Task Force is coordinating the work of Government departments that are undertaking social, economic and infrastructure projects that will be ensuring continued sustainability and prosperity for the communities in the area of the proposed dam.

### SW3. QUEENSLAND STATE ARCHIVES COMMUNITY HISTORY PROJECT - BOONAH

#### Project Description

This project will work towards two outcomes. Firstly, the production of a quality booklet incorporating text and photographs which will provide a lasting acknowledgement of selected historical aspects of the area affected by the proposed dam. Secondly, the staging of community archive workshops by expert staff from Queensland State Archives (QSA) that will assist local historical groups and individuals with advice on recording and managing local historical materials, including photographic collections.

#### Project Purpose

The purpose of QSA's Community History project is to acknowledge and document selected aspects of historical significance in the regions and communities that surround the proposed dam at Wyaralong.

#### Progress report

- In August 2006, staff of QSA consulted with representatives from the Boonah Shire Council to scope project options suitable to their community's requirements. The Mayor of Boonah agreed that an

historical booklet would have a lasting positive affect for the community.

- After a tender process in late 2006, professional historians were appointed in January 2007, by QSA, to research and write the booklet. Professor Kay Saunders AM and Dr Murray Johnson will finalise a research brief after consultation with Council representatives.
- It is anticipated that two Community Archive Workshops will be presented in the Boonah region during 2007. The first workshop will be delivered in early 2007, with a date confirmed next month.
- This project commenced with QSA consultation with the Boonah Shire Council in August 2006. As the professional historians authoring the booklet commence their research, a meeting with the representatives from the Boonah Shire Council, the historians and QSA staff occurred in February 2007.

## ECONOMIC STUDIES AND PROJECTS

### EW1. THE "BOONAH SHIRE FUTURES – IMPLEMENTATION PLAN"

#### Project Description

Boonah Shire Council is developing the Boonah Shire Futures Plan to provide a long term strategic framework that will guide the sustainable development of Boonah Shire. This study will assist with the development of the "Boonah Shire Futures - Implementation Plan" that will include a range of studies, strategies and action plans to be undertaken over a two year period.

#### Purpose of the Project

The Implementation Plan will result in;

- the development of a Rural Communities Economic Development Strategy for Boonah Shire promoting rural diversification and growth through stimulation of industry development and investment attraction;
- the development of Boonah Shire Infrastructure Plan that will address infrastructure planning consistent with the State Government's South East Regional Plan 2005- 2006 and will include the economic, social and environmental impacts (including land use changes) of the construction of the proposed Wyaralong Dam; and
- a model for other Queensland rural shires and towns to follow when developing rural futures strategies in response to the South East Queensland Plan and other regional strategies.

#### Progress Report

- A "one-off" grant of \$200,000 has been allocated by the Queensland Government. This has been funded equally by the departments of State Development, Natural Resources and Water, Local Government, Planning, Sport and Recreation and Primary Industries and Fisheries.
- The State Government involvement in this project will be

managed by the Department of State Development.

- State Government funding is to be matched dollar for dollar by the Boonah Shire Council.
- Formal funding agreements are currently being drawn up for signature by the four State Government departments and the Boonah Shire Council.
- The program of community consultation required, for the development of the Boonah Shire Futures Plan, will be released after the details for the study are finalised.

## EW3. BUSINESS ADJUSTMENT SCHEME

### Project Description

The Department of Primary Industries and Fisheries, and the Department of State Development, have established a Business Adjustment Scheme. The scheme enables eligible businesses to seek financial assistance for business advice, business restructure or business exit (subject to guidelines).

Business advice assistance reimburses eligible businesses for costs associated with obtaining financial advice regarding the adverse affect of the proposed dam on their business.

Business restructure assistance enables eligible businesses to develop and implement business strategies to improve the ongoing viability of their business.

Business exit assistance provides a one-off payment to enable eligible businesses to exit the business as the only realistic option identified as a result of the dam announcement.

### Project Purpose

The purpose of the Business Adjustment Scheme is to provide financial assistance to eligible businesses that are significantly affected by the announcement of the proposed dam at Wyaralong.

### Progress Report

- The scheme is being administered by the Queensland Rural Adjustment Authority (QRAA), on behalf of the Queensland Government. Information has been advertised

in CFTF newsletters. Application forms are publicly available on QRAA's website (<http://www.qraa.qld.gov.au/>).

- QRAA held an information session in Boonah on 6 December 2006 to inform business enterprises of the scheme.

### Timelines/Milestones

This is an ongoing service that is available to eligible businesses. The scheme will be reviewed in December 2008.

This is an ongoing service that is available to eligible workers. The scheme will be reviewed in December 2008.

## LAND USE AND INFRASTRUCTURE STUDIES

### WL1. LAND USE AND INFRASTRUCTURE PLANNING STUDY FOR THE WYARALONG DAM

#### Project Description

The Office of Urban Management (OUM) and the Department of Local Government, Planning, Sport and Recreation (DLGPSR) are jointly undertaking the Land Use and Infrastructure Planning Study for the Wyaralong area.

#### Study Purpose

The purpose of the planning study is to investigate the impacts on existing land uses and infrastructure and the potential opportunities to be incorporated in a long term land use plan and infrastructure program.

The planning study will investigate the most suitable planning tools to implement the land use plan and infrastructure program, for example rural precincts plans and amendments to the Boonah and Beaudesert planning schemes.

#### Progress report

- Work on the study has commenced. The milestones for the study are listed below.
- A guideline for Rural Precinct Planning is currently being prepared and will be available for stakeholder review in early 2007. In addition, a draft version of the Rural Futures Strategy will be publicly available for comment in mid 2007, with submissions to inform the final Rural Futures Strategy to be released at the end of 2007.

#### Timelines/Milestones

- A community consultation program for the Land Use and Infrastructure Planning Study will be developed in early 2007.
- Collate and review background material - March 2007.
- Development of land use and infrastructure options - April 2007.
- Draft proposed land use plan and infrastructure program - mid 2007.
- Finalisation of statutory land use plan and infrastructure program - late 2007.

# NATIVE TITLE INFORMATION MEETING HELD

Queensland Water Infrastructure (QWI) hosted Native Title Information Meetings for the proposed Wyaralong Dam on Saturday 3 February and Sunday 4 February at the Beaudesert State High School. QWI met with those indigenous persons who assert a native title interest for the project area.

QWI's Chief Executive Officer, Mr Graeme Newton, said the meetings were the first stage of a comprehensive native title and cultural heritage process.

"The focus of the meetings was to give those indigenous persons who have a native title interest in the project area an opportunity to gain information about the process," Mr Newton said.

"QWI wishes to reach a native title agreement for the project area, and the meetings began the process of identifying those people who claim to have an interest in the project area to ensure that their rights are accommodated within the agreement," he said.

The agreement will take the form of an Indigenous Land Use Agreement (ILUA), and will deal with the voluntary acquisition of native title and management of indigenous cultural heritage for the project area.

QWI is working to ensure that all indigenous persons with an interest in the area are consulted throughout the process, additional to those persons who have registered a native title claim over part of the project area. The Jagera People's native title claim takes in part of the project area north of Teviot Brook.

# TRAILS PART OF ONGOING NEW VISITOR PROGRAMS

The recent announcement of the South East Queensland regional trails program will further add to the visitor opportunities to be created in the area of the proposed Wyaralong Dam.

As part of the community futures strategy for the proposed Wyaralong Dam, the Community Futures Task Force is working closely with Queensland Tourism and the Boonah Shire Council to foster visitor and tourist strategies based on the new dam.

Tourism Queensland is part of the CFTF and will be contributing to the development and implementation of tourism and visitor strategies.

The Queensland Government recently announced an investment of \$8.8 million over the next five years to develop three regional recreation trails and implement the South East Queensland (SEQ) Regional Trails Strategy.

The Boonah to Ipswich Recreation Trail is the major initiative in this program.

Part of the funding will go towards developing the Boonah to Ipswich Recreation Trail, which will be approximately 76 kilometres and will cater for the current and future populations of southern inland SEQ, including growth areas in Greater Ipswich and the Western Corridor.

The Boonah to Ipswich Trail will provide recreational links for these communities to an extensive rugged and scenic area where more than ten peaks rise above 330 metres in a landscape dominated by native vegetation.

It will traverse wooded hills and farmlands, catering for walkers, mountain bikers and horse riders.

**The Active Trails: A Strategy for Regional Trails in South East Queensland** was prepared by the Queensland Outdoor Recreation Federation Inc. for the Queensland Government and the Council of Mayors (SEQ).

The purpose of the Strategy is to inform and guide future investment in regional recreation trail planning, development and management. The Strategy was funded by the Council of Mayors (SEQ); Department of Local Government, Planning, Sport and Recreation; Queensland Health; Department of Natural Resources and Water and the Environmental Protection Agency. The development of the Strategy was guided by input from many stakeholders with interests in recreation trails.

## DRAFT TERMS OF REFERENCE CLOSE

The period for public submissions on the draft Terms of Reference (ToR) for the proposed Wyaralong Dam Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) will close on Monday 26 February.

Following this date, the Coordinator-General will finalise the ToR, and will consider all comments received about the draft ToR. The final ToR will then be provided to Queensland Water Infrastructure (QWI) and made available publicly.

QWI will prepare an EIS in accordance with the requirements of the final ToR. Once the EIS has been prepared to the satisfaction of the Coordinator-General, a public notice will be advertised in relevant newspapers circulating in the district, the state and nationally.

### The notice will advise:

- where copies of the EIS are available for inspection and how it can be purchased;
- that submissions may be made to the Coordinator-General about the EIS; and
- the submission period.

Based on the submissions received regarding the content of the EIS, QWI may then be required to prepare a supplementary EIS to address specific matters raised.

At the completion of the EIS, the Coordinator-General will prepare a report evaluating the EIS and other related material, pursuant to s35 of State Development Public Works Organisation Act 1971. The Coordinator-General's report will be publicly notified and a copy provided to the Federal Minister for Environment and Water Resources to enable his assessment under Part 9 of the Environment Protection and Biodiversity Conservation Act 1999 to commence.

## TENDERS CLOSE FOR LOGAN RIVER CATCHMENT EARLY WORKS

Queensland Water Infrastructure (QWI) received a number of submissions for the Logan River Catchment Early Works tender in early February 2007.

QWI is pleased with the number and quality of the submissions and is currently reviewing the proposals. QWI expects to make an announcement on the successful alliance by late March 2007.

The Logan River Catchment Early Works project encompasses Cedar Grove Weir, Bromelton Offstream Storage and the proposed Wyaralong Dam Access Road.

These projects are being developed by Queensland Water Infrastructure Pty Ltd (QWI), on behalf of the Queensland Government. QWI was established by the Queensland Government in June 2006 to progress feasibility assessment and delivery of water infrastructure projects in South East Queensland.

Cedar Grove Weir is due for completion by the end of December 2007, with the other two projects scheduled for completion by mid 2009.

## NO CATCHMENT POWERS PROPOSED

There is no intention by the Department of Natural Resources and Water (DNRW) to extend the declared catchment powers under the Water Act to the proposed Wyaralong Dam.

In a report to the Community Futures Task Force, DNRW reaffirmed its previous announcements that there was no intention to take up the powers.

DNRW has advised that broader matters of land use in catchments of major dams may be considered in local government planning schemes or under environmental protection legislation.
